## Week of Monday, April 7, 2025

The Henderson County Senior Softball Association kicked off its 2025 travel season this past week. The season was scheduled to begin on Monday, April 7th, with the Lake Keowee Eagles traveling to Jackson Park to face the Henderson County 68+ Sluggers in the Clayton League opener. However, in a "good news, bad news" situation, the game was postponed due to inclement weather. The good news, of course, was that we received some badly needed rain to help combat the recent spate of forest fires. Naturally, the bad news was that we did not get to play the game. This series has been rescheduled to Monday, April 28th at Jackson Park.

While the Monday opener was postponed, the Henderson County 70+ mixed Sluggers did get to start their season with a trip to the new turf fields at Winged Deer Park in Johnson City, Tennessee, on Wednesday, April 9th. The mixed 70+ Sluggers are coached by Andy Hinds and were sponsored for these games by

Park Ford. Tri-Cities normally fields competitive teams. especially for home games, and this day was no different. In game one, Tri-Cities held a 3-0 lead after two innings of play. However, the mixed Sluggers battled back to take an 8-3 lead over the next three innings. Tri-Cities rallied late, but Henderson County held on to capture a 10-6 victory. Over the middle three innings, the Sluggers matched or exceeded the runs scored by Tri-Cities and narrowed the margin to 16-14. Unfortunately, the Sluggers would not score again while Tri-Cities put up six more runs to walk away with a 22-14 win. Don Chambers pitched well but suffered the loss on the mound. The Sluggers did not have a scorebook, so I do not have statistics to report from the games. Unfortunately, there were a few costly errors that led to some Tri-Cities runs.
